to see, close your eyes

Ana Vidigal is a key artist on the Portuguese art scene. The CCCOD presented some of her works in 2022, as part of the major group show «All I Want. Portuguese women artists from 1900 to 2020». The art centre hopes to deepen the understanding of this artist by devoting a solo exhibition to her for the first time in France.

Following in the footsteps of exhibitions at the CCCOD dedicated to major figures of painters, such as the Egyptian artist Ghada Amer, the Argentinian artist Ad Minoliti and the French artist Cécile Bart, this exhibition plunges visitors into a new form of painting, into a culture with a singular history, and into the intimacy of an artist who questions the archive and individual and collective memory.

# ana vidigal

biography

> Born in Lisbon (Portugal) in 1960, Ana Vidigal graduated in painting from the École Supérieure des Beaux-Arts in Lisbon in 1984. She lives and works in Lisbon.

Ana Vidigal's immense body of works has been the subject of numerous exhibitions in her native country since the 1980s. Between 1985 and 1987, she received a grant from the Calouste Gulbenkian Foundation. In 2010, a survey show was held at the Gulbenkian Centre for Modern Art in Lisbon. Curated by Isabel Carlos, the exhibition entitled *Menina Limpa*, *Menina Suja* (Clean Girl, Dirty Girl) looked back over thirty years of the artist's work.

Since then, Ana Vidigal has produced new works in a variety of contexts, both in institutional settings and in alternative venues such as galleries and artist-run spaces. In so doing, Ana Vidigal has demonstrated her ability to constantly question her work and to place it in a contemporary context.

## the exhibition

## ana vidigal « to see, close your eyes »

This new exhibition, entitled «To see, close your eyes», presents works specifically produced by Ana Vidigal as well as a selection of recent works.

It focuses on the last fifteen years of the artist's creative work, and her paintings and collages.

Diving into the layers of the works of this 'daughter of the Revolution', the viewer is seized by the resurgence of the past, by multiple references to the world of childhood, that of Ana Vidigal in particular, that is linked to the history of Portugal and its journey to democracy, of which she experienced the beginnings.

The images in her paintings come from a variety of registers. Blended together, the latter create compositions that are both charming and obscure, sometimes revealing a form of criticism of today's society.

Her joyful, provocative work tackles subjects in a concealed way, bringing into play an 'aesthetic of the little', based primarily on the archive. The archive acts as both method and form, constituting a body that she re-enacts in each of her creations. These images, which have shaped her conception of the world, combine with words to form an indirect view of the world in the form of unparalleled visual poetry.

The exhibition has not been thought to be chronological. Instead, it takes a thematic and formal approach, bringing together works from different periods.

The artist is also presenting an intervention in the transparent galleries surrounding the black gallery. Produced on site by the artist, it is visible from the outside of the art centre.


